Legislation

Advocating with our legislators and testifying on bills regarding housing is a valuable contribution to addressing the needs of New Mainers. On Friday, May 12th at 9:00 AM, the bill <u>LD 1721</u>, An Act to Create Transitional Housing Communities for Homeless Populations in the State, is scheduled for a public hearing before the legislature's Housing Committee. Among other things, the bill creates a fund to help catalyze the creation of transitional housing communities throughout the state. Transitional housing is permanent housing that is used temporarily by people, usually for up to 24 months at a time. It is a missing link in our system, and asylum seekers are prime candidates for transitional housing. Without it, we've had to rely heavily on our hotels. CCCUCC Legal Fund

The legal process Asylum Seekers must go through is comprised of many steps that can be confusing for one who is an English speaker, let alone one who does not have English as their native language. Every step along the way includes paperwork that must be filled out perfectly, processes that must be followed, interviews and appointments where preparation is essential as missteps can lead to denial of asylum. Asylum seekers who have experienced immigration lawyers to guide them through the process are 60-70% for more likely to gain asylum.
